The draw will take place after the 9am Mass on the 4th Sunday of Advent


Donations of bottles, gift sets, boxes of chocolates, sweets, selection boxes, mince pies etc are welcome and there is a box in the church porch.

We are hoping to put together 3 main hamper prizes, plus seven smaller prizes


## SANCTUARY LAMPS












